46 AN IRISH GEORGE III SILVER BRIGHT CUT ENGRAVED OLD ENGLISH PATTERN BASTING SPOON,

Dublin 1786, mark of John Kelly, the bowl fitted with straining division, the pointed handle decorated to the rims with bright cut engraving, the handle terminal crested with an oval and also crested to the reverse (c.4ozs). 30.5cm long

47 AN IRISH GEORGE III SILVER BRIGHT CUT ENGRAVED NEOCLASSICAL FEATHER EDGE TAPERING HANDLED

LADLE, with fluted shell bowl, Dublin marks c.1787, (rubbed) makers mark probably that of John Pittar, the loop handle terminal crested (c.4.5ozs), 33cm long Note: Soup ladles with curved handles and hemispherical bowls were designed to serve from soup tureens

Dublin 1784, mark of Michael Keating, in neoclassical style, the handle terminal crested within a ribbon tied oval. (c.3ozs), 39.5cm long

Dublin 1798, mark of John Power, the bright cut engraved tapering handle terminating with a fluted shell bowl. (c.2ozs), 20.5cm long
